Mrs Ellerington-Jennings proposed, M Gillyon-Powell seconded, and all were in favour of the payphone and box being removed. The phone box has been vandalised and BT would not make good if the parish council were to adopt it.

19-20/113 Financial matters:

Tendering - Grass cutting South Street, Leven: The clerk had invited 3 people/companies to tender for the 2-year contract to cut the grass at the Jubilee Garden and to strim around the planters on the grass verges. All the tenders were considered, and S Mathison proposed, Mrs Ellerington-Jennings seconded, and all agreed to award the contract to NNC Building and Garden Services, Leven.

19-20/114 'Tour de Yorkshire' Thursday, 30 April 2020: As the Tour de Yorkshire is to pass through the village, it was decided that the parish council would apply for grant funding from East Riding of Yorkshire Council to pay for bunting to put up along the route. The parish council are hoping that the residents will take part in decorating the outside of their properties and gardens and are organizing a competition for the 'best dressed' property or business.

19-20/115 Representatives reports:

Police: S Mathison reported that there were allegedly 3 or 4 youths on quad bikes riding through the village with balaclavas, rucksacks and no lights on during the early hours of the morning. There have been no reports of any burglaries in the village.

Scouts: M Gillyon-Powell reported that the scouts have already started planning activities for 2020 including an Archery Camp and have an entry in for the Yorkshire Wolds Challenge to be held later in the year.

Leven & Brandesburton Horticultural Society: D Gillyon-Powell reported that the Scouts and Horticultural Society are going to team together in organizing the 'Open Gardens' in Leven this year.

Leven Youth Club: D Thorne reported that there appears to be a lack of interest amongst the parents to be helpers at the Youth Club. 'Stitch' is however, keeping the youth club going.

Leven Playingfields Association: The annual auction is to take place on 4 April 2020.

19-20/116 General purpose matters:

East Street: Vehicles continue to exit from East Street through the one-way system the wrong way. The clerk is to contact East Riding of Yorkshire Council to ask for new road markings and if the no entry signs can be made larger.

Village planters: 7 new planters have been paid for by businesses in the village which the parish council are very grateful for. The planters have now been ordered and should be delivered within 6-8 weeks. A business is also wanting to pay for new lamppost baskets and a quote will be obtained.

Sandholme Lane: A resident has complained regarding the speed that motorists are travelling at when approaching Carr Lane from Sandholme Lane. An area of 18 yards is deregulated and the clerk is to ask Highways why this is the case. This area of Sandholme Lane is heavily used by pedestrians with children and animals as well as horse riders.
